2016 PPI Radio Awards winners unveiled

At a ceremony held tonight at the Lyrath Estate Hotel, Kilkenny, the 2016 PPI Radio Awards winners were revealed. Comedian and radio DJ, Dermot Whelan, presented tonight's Awards which were attended by over 700 guests from all over Ireland. The event is the highlight of the radio calendar each year.

The judging process involved over 90 individuals who listened to 282 hours submitted in 700 entries. The judges commented that the standard of entries this year stood out as one of the strongest ever.

Full Service Station of the Year for 2016 was awarded to BBC Radio Ulster. Music Station of the Year was won by Corks Red FM 104-106 and Local Station of the Year was won by Radio Kerry. The Outstanding Achievement Award was presented to Scott Williams (IBI) and JP Coakley (RTÉ) for their work on the Irish Radioplayer.

Chair of the PPI Radio Awards committee, Sean Murtagh, said at the event "Each year, the PPIs get better and better and I'm delighted to say that 2016 is no exception. The standard of entries is getting higher, the competition is getting tougher and the desire to win a PPI is greater than at any time in our 16 year history. Just making the shortlist is a huge achievement in itself and a sign from your peers that you've made the grade. We are deeply indebted to the commitment, dedication and professionalism of the Awards Committee members and all of our 90 judges who give freely and generously of their time in order to ensure that the PPIs continue to be the most sought-after accolade in Irish radio."

Michael O'Keeffe Chief Executive of BAI said "The BAI has been closely involved with the PPI Radio Awards since their inception and has been particularly pleased to witness not just the growth in stature of the Awards themselves but also the value placed on being nominated or winning an award. I believe that this is a key measure of the Awards' success. The quality and diversity of submissions is testament to the strength and creativity of the sector and a strong indication of the nature of the services that can be enjoyed by listeners every day. I would like to sincerely congratulate all the nominees and deserved award winners of PPI Radio Awards in 2016.

NOTES TO EDITORS:

PPI

PPI acts as a central administrator for record companies' rights in the public performance, broadcasting and reproduction of their recordings. It collects royalties on behalf of its members- Irish and multinational record companies and performers-in one single licence fee, which is distributed in turn to the relevant parties.

BAI

The Broadcasting Authority of Ireland (BAI) was established in October 2009 as the single content regulator of broadcasting in Ireland.

The functions of the BAI include; the licensing of radio and television services on a variety of transmission platforms; the licensing of digital multiplex operators; the development of codes and rules in relation to programming and advertising standards; the monitoring of services to ensure that broadcasters comply with their statutory obligations and contract terms; and, the consideration of complaints. The BAI is also responsible for the operation of Broadcasting Funding Schemes which are financed by the television licence fee.
